BOROUGH OF METUCHEN COUNCIL MINUTES DECEMBER 11, 2023 7:30 PM

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall on Monday, December 11, 2023.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Busch.

Mayor Busch asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call

Mayor Busch asked for a roll call.

Present were Councilmembers Branch, Giamboi, Hirsch, Hyman, Council President Delia, and Mayor Busch. Councilmember Kandel was absent. Also present were Borough Administrator Melissa Perilstein, Borough Clerk Deborah Zupan, and Borough Attorney Denis Murphy.

Adequate Notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was sent to the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger on December 21, 2022, posted in Borough Hall, and on file in the Clerk's Office. All requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act have been satisfied.

As this was Dan Hirsch's last meeting as a Councilmember, Mayor Busch spoke about his time on Council and all Councilmember Hirsch has given to the community. Other Councilmembers and the Borough Administrator expressed their admiration and gratitude as well.

As Jay Muldoon, Director of Economic Development, was retiring, Mayor Busch spoke of his many contributions and accomplishments over the years. The Councilmembers and the Borough Administrator expressed their admiration and gratitude as well. Mayor Busch invited former Mayor Pete Cammarano to speak as well. Mr. Muldoon spoke about his career and experiences working for the Borough and expressed his gratitude to many of those he has worked with.

Agenda Session

Council President Delia made a motion to open the Agenda Session, second by Councilmember Giamboi, with all in favor, motion carried, 5-0.

Council President Delia added Resolution 2023-304 to the New Business Consent Agenda.

With no further action taken, Council President Delia made a motion to close the Agenda Session, second by Councilmember Giamboi, with all in favor, motion carried, 5-0.

Public Comment

Mayor Busch opened Public Comment to any members of the public wishing to speak.

Daryl Nieliwocki, 44 Delaware Avenue, spoke on behalf of his neighbors regarding the trees along the railway line in Oakland Park and noted that many trees had been taking down, adding to noise and air pollution in the area. Additionally, some of the maintenance the Borough has done on the paths has cut back on vegetation. Mr. Nieliwocki requested that the Borough maintain the character and vegetation of the park for the benefit of all. He provided handouts to the Mayor and Council detailing some suggestions.

Chris Collicutt, 70 Maple Avenue, stated that both he and his wife are striking nurses from Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital. He spoke about the strike and the importance of safe staff to patient ratios. He requested that Council pass a resolution in support of the Safe Staffing bills before the State Legislature. Mr. Collicutt spoke about his experiences as a nurse during the COVID pandemic, and how the service and sacrifices of healthcare workers during that time seems to have been forgotten.

Todd Pagel, 313 Midland Avenue, commented on the contributions Jay Muldoon had made to the Borough, particularly regarding pedestrian and bicycle safety. Mr. Pagel also took the

opportunity to applaud the Borough regarding parking, specifically the convenience of the parking app and the ability to pay for parking by credit card.

Ashley, an Edison resident, one of the striking nurses from Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, spoke about the importance of the safety of both nurses and patients, and requested that Council pass a resolution in support of the Safe Staffing bills.

Seeing no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Busch closed the Public Comment. Mayor Busch remarked that he and the Council have respect and appreciation for nurses and are concerned about safe staffing levels. He stated that he has discussed the issue with State representatives, but that passing a municipal resolution when municipal input has not been asked for would not have an impact. Mayor Busch reiterated his support for the nurses but stated that Metuchen would not be passing a resolution as requested.

 - d. PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING
 - e. PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTION
 - f. EPIDEMIOLOGY AND BIOTERRORISM
- 2. All of the above-mentioned activities shall be provided in accordance with the Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of Health in New Jersey as set forth in N.J.A.C. Title 8:52-1.1 *et seq.* and the regulations promulgated under the County Environmental Health Act (CEHA) N.J.A.C. 7:1H *et seq.*
- 3. In addition to the above public health services, the County will continue to provide specialized grant services.
- 4. The term of this contract shall be for two (2) years commencing on January 1, 2024 and terminating December 31, 2025, unless terminated earlier as provided for hereinafter.
- 5. The base cost for the provision of the aforesaid health services shall be as follows: 2024 - \$59,713.90 2025 - \$60,908.17
