BOROUGH OF METUCHEN COUNCIL MINUTES January 30, 2023 7:30 PM

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall on Monday, January 30, 2023

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Busch.

Adequate Notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was sent to the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger on December 21, 2022, posted in Borough Hall, and on file in the Clerk's Office. All requirements of the "Open Public Meetings Act" have been satisfied.

Mayor Busch congratulated Councilmember Rasmussen on her recent marriage, which occurred in the council chambers of Borough Hall.

Mayor Busch asked all to rise for the flag salute.

Roll Call

Mayor Busch asked for a roll call.

Present were Councilmembers Branch, Hirsch, Hyman, Kandel, Rasmussen, and Mayor Busch. Council President Delia was absent. Also present were Borough Administrator Melissa Perilstein, Borough Clerk Deborah Zupan, and Borough Attorney Denis Murphy.

Councilmember Kandel reported on his first meeting as Pool Commission Liaison.

Councilmember Hyman reported on her first meeting with the Municipal Alliance Committee and their anticipated upcoming transition to becoming the Metuchen CARES Committee.

Councilmember Hirsch reported that the Library will partner with the Metuchen Arts Council to offer concerts and other musical programs to the community. Their Lunar New Year Celebration was a big success. The Library was also awarded a \$15,000 Communication Access Service Grant through the Middlesex County Office of Aging and Disabled in 2022. He encouraged everyone to visit the Library's website for upcoming programs, resources, and services.
