# ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF REAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF METUCHEN SPECIFICALLY BLOCK 132, LOTS 10 THROUGH 27, AND LOTS 49 THROUGH 51, COMMONLY KNOWN AS 1 SAFETY PLACE FROM METUCHEN SAFETY COUNCIL, INC. ("METUCHEN EMS") FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW EMERGENCY SERVICES BUILDING AND OUTBUILDING PROJECT

**WHEREAS**, the Borough is in the process of the design and construction of a new Emergency Services Building and Outbuilding Project to be located at 1 Safety Place, Metuchen, New Jersey for among other things a new location for the Metuchen Fire Department and Metuchen EMS; and

**WHEREAS**, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-5(a) provides that any municipality, by ordinance, may provide for the acquisition of real property by purchase; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-5, have determined to acquire and purchase certain real estate, Block 132, Lot 10 through 27, and Lots 49 through 51, commonly known as 1 Safety Place ("the Property") to be used for municipal purposes for the site of a future Emergency Services Building and Outbuilding in the Borough of Metuchen; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-5(a)(1), and the Eminent Domain Act of 1971 *N.J.S.A.* 20:3-1 et seq. (the "Eminent Domain Act") the Borough is authorized to acquire the Property for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, Metuchen Safety Council, Inc. ("Metuchen EMS") is the owner of the real property located at Block 132, Lots 10 through 27, and Lots 49 through 51 as shown on the tax map of the Borough of Metuchen, NJ; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough seeks to acquire title to the Property in order to complete the design and construction of the new Emergency Services Building and Outbuilding Project which shall include, among other things, space for the continued operations of the Metuchen Fire Department and the Metuchen EMS; and

WHEREAS, the Metuchen EMS wishes to convey the Property to the Borough of Metuchen in return for, among other things, short-term lease agreements for Metuchen EMS' continued operations and temporary location/s at the Borough's costs and expense and a long-term lease agreement between the Metuchen EMS and the Borough of Metuchen that would permit the Metuchen EMS to utilize a portion of the new Emergency Services Building and Outbuilding for its continued operations for a nominal cost to the Metuchen EMS; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Metuchen has discussed the proposed acquisition with the Metuchen EMS and have negotiated and drafted the general terms and conditions of the sale and the Borough's acquisition, entitled "Agreement of Sale Between the Metuchen Safety Council, Inc. and the Borough of Metuchen" ("Agreement of Sale"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen have determined that the acquisition under the terms and conditions of the Agreement of Sale of the Property is in the best interest of the Borough of Metuchen for its future public use for among other things, the location of the Metuchen Fire Department and the Metuchen EMS.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen hereby authorize the acquisition and purchase of Block 132, Lots 10 through 27, and Lots 49 through 51 on the tax maps of the Borough of Metuchen, commonly known as 1 Safety Place, Metuchen, New Jersey according to the specific terms and condition of the Agreement of Sale negotiated by the Parties; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, by the Borough Council that the Mayor, and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized, directed and empowered to the execute the Agreement of Sale in the form consistent with the Agreement of Sale on file with the Borough Clerk and in a final form acceptable to the Mayor and Borough Administrator; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that the Mayor, Borough Clerk, Borough Administrator, and Borough Attorney, and any other Borough officials and employees as directed by the Borough Administrator ("Authorized Persons") are hereby authorized, directed and empowered to carry out all necessary actions in order to effectuate and comply with the terms and provisions of the Agreement of Sale, and to take all other necessary action and execute any required documents in order to effect the purchase and acquisition and transfer of title of the Property to the Borough of Metuchen; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that the Mayor, Borough Clerk, Borough Administrator, and Borough Attorney, and any other Borough officials and employees as directed by the Borough Administrator ("Authorized Persons") are hereby authorized, directed and empowered to negotiate, enter into such further lease agreements for a nominal amount with the Metuchen EMS for its continued location at 1 Safety Place until such time it is necessary for the Borough to take possession of the Property and for the temporary location/s of the Metuchen EMS' operations and for the Long Term Lease Agreement with the Metuchen EMS for Metuchen EMS to utilize a portion of the new Emergency Services Building and Outbuilding upon its completion for its continued operations for a nominal cost to the Metuchen EMS; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that any and all actions previously taken by the Authorized Persons in connection with the purchase and acquisition of the Property are hereby ratified and confirmed; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies and should any section, clause, sentence or provision of any item in this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that this Ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and publication as provided by law.

**WHEREAS**, on February 25, 2024 a portion of sanitary sewer pipe within the Borough of Metuchen failed causing the need for remediation, repair and/or replacement to a portion of sanitary sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Coordinator, as well as the Borough Administrator, have advised that until such time as the appropriate repairs are completed to the sanitary sewer system within the Borough, and is fully functional and is operating, delays in the sanitary sewer infrastructure repairs would cause an immediate health hazard; and

**WHEREAS**, the Emergency Management Coordinator and the Borough Administrator have recommended to the Mayor and Council and Qualified Purchasing Agent that an emergency declaration be made, with authorization to proceed with an emergent contract for the repair and/or replacement of a portion of sanitary sewer infrastructure and the need for the performance of a contract and delivery of goods and services and the need to invoke *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-6.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that due to the failure of a portion of sanitary sewer infrastructure within the Borough of Metuchen and the immediate health hazard caused thereby and the specific conditions expressed by the Emergency Management Coordinator and Borough Administrator, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen hereby declares an emergency and authorizes the use of the emergency contract procedures of *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-6 for the repair and/or replacement of the failed sanitary sewer infrastructure.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that it hereby authorizes the Mayor, Borough Clerk, Borough Administrator, Chief Financial Officer/Qualified Purchasing Agent, the Emergency Management Coordinator, Borough Engineer and all other Borough officials and employees to take all action necessary to procure an emergency contract/s for the repair and/or replacement of the affected sanitary sewer infrastructure in an expeditious fashion.
