

# UNDERSTANDING VOTE-BY-MAIL

## AUTOMATIC VOTE-BY-MAIL



All active registered voters will be automatically sent a vote-by-mail ballot without needing to apply. All ballots will be sent by October 5th. If you do not receive a ballot by the second week of October, or if you need a replacement ballot, please contact your County Clerk.

## BALLOT REJECTION

Ballots tentatively rejected due to a signature issue, either the signature does not match or the signature is missing, can be corrected. This is also known as “curing” a ballot. When the ballot is tentatively rejected, the voter will be sent a notice in the mail. This notice will include a form that the voter must complete and return in-person, by fax, email, or mail by the stated deadline to cure the ballot.

# VOTE-BY-MAIL ELECTION 2020

## RETURNING YOUR BALLOT

You have several options to return your vote-by-mail ballot:

- Return via mail: return your ballot ASAP. Your ballot must be postmarked by 11/3 (Election Day).
- Return via a secure ballot drop box: return your ballot by 8 pm on 11/3 (Election Day).
- Return in-person to your Board of Elections office: return your ballot by 8 pm on 11/3 (Election Day).
- Return in-person to your designated polling place: return your ballot by 8 pm on 11/3 (Election Day).

Vote early! Don't wait until Election Day to return your completed ballot.

## TRACK YOUR BALLOT



Track your ballot by using the "Track My Ballot" tool on the New Jersey Division of Elections website. You will be able to see when your ballot has been received and accepted.
